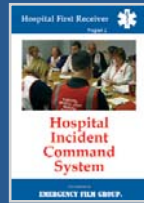
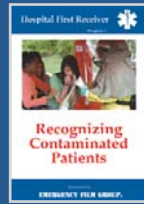

## 4 Modules plus Guide

### 1) Recognizing Contaminated Patients

Reviews how victims become contaminated, describes the signs & symptoms associated with exposure to hazmats or WMDs, and outlines the training required of First Receivers to meet OSHA 1910.120 (Hazwoper) requirements. Also effective as a stand-alone program as Awareness level training for all hospital staff. 26 minutes.

### 2) Hospital Incident Command System

This section covers ICS, the National Incident Management System and the development of the Hospital Incident Command System (HICS). It describes the roles and responsibilities of the key players in a response as they relate to mass casualty emergency situations. Helps facilities update incident management plans. 27 minutes.

### 3) Self Protection

Reviews NIOSH, NFPA, OSHA, and EPA regulations and standards for protective clothing and respiratory protection. Discusses medical and safety considerations of using protective clothing, including avoiding heat injuries and biological exposure. Depicts procedures for donning, doffing, inspection & storage of equipment. 29 minutes.

### 4) Patient Decontamination

This module explains the importance of decontamination and using safe work practices to avoid exposure. Covers setting up the decon area, decon techniques for ambulatory & non-ambulatory patients, modesty issues, security, and termination of the operation. 27 minutes.

Includes everything an Instructor requires to organize and present a training seminar: agenda, objectives, ideas for activities & drills, and both pre- and post-seminar tests. Also included are reference materials that will be of interest to First Receivers. 74 pages.
